West Elementary School in Mountain Home, Idaho, was considered a "failing" school for eight years in terms of Adequate Yearly Progress. One year ago, 30% of West Elementary School students failed the reading portion of the Idaho state test (ISAT) and only 45% of students were considered proficient in reading. With a large population of both economically disadvantaged students and Englishlanguage learners, the school district began to focus on boosting literacy and implementing successful and sustainable change for all of their students.

West Elementary School was focused on setting clear and measurable goals to increase reading proficiency in their school. Administrators at the school determined that their three primary goals were to:

- Increase reading proficiency
- Strengthen community & family relationships and mutual involvement



Implementation

After the entire West Elementary staff attended myON Professional Development sessions, teachers were committed to supplementing classroom instruction with myON reader as well as encouraging their students to read independently on myON. As a dedicated participant in the myON Winter and Summer organized reading challenges, West Elementary's initial results were incredible.
